

Executive Board

Overseeing strategic direction and delivery of the Caithness & north Sutherland Programme. Board members meet quarterly to review progress with the CNSRP Programme. Executive Board take account of advice and comments given by members of the Advisory Board, which meets approximately two weeks before each Executive Board meeting. The Board will discuss and agree forward strategy for the delivery of the CNSRP Programme's actions, focusing in particular on the delivery of high priority actions. It will direct the work of the Programme Manager and the Delivery Group to ensure that all actions are allocated to an appropriate lead body and given realistic timetables for implementation.

Membership:

The membership of the Executive Board reflects the sense of priority given to the development of the area's economy by the main partner bodies. Uniquely, the region's key public sector decision-makers come together on a quarterly basis to discuss the economy of a particular area, offering the local community direct input from (and access to) the highest level of professional engagement. Under independent Chairmanship the Board is designed to offer the economic transition process its best chance of success. Whilst named positions are listed for member organisations, if the individual member is not able to attend a meeting it is the responsibility of the member to identify a suitable substitute who can represent the organisation's interests and is able to discharge the organisation's remit on the Group.
